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












While DogTrekker regularly updates off-leash rules, it is important to check to be sure that this area still allows voice control prior to removing your dog's leash.

This small but popular off-leash dog beach sits where the Noyo River enters the Pacific Ocean. The beach parking area is located at the end of North Harbor Drive under the Highway 1 bridge over the Noyo River and Harbor Channel.

After visiting the beach, stop at Nemo's Fishmarket on N. Harbor Drive where you and your dog can sit on the deck and have lunch.

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
Advantage: Mendocino & the North Coast!



One dog-friendly Mendocino drive: Highway 128

Start your road trip at Cloverdale, turning off Highway 101 and heading west on Highway 128. This scenic route offers up many delights, including the <u>Boonville</u> <u>General Store</u> in southern <u>Mendocino County</u>. The store is a stellar pit stop for sandwiches, soups, pizzas and other deli delights. Special adventures for furry friends

Discover Mendocino's inland empire

Many <u>Mendocino County visitors</u> stick to the Instagram-worthy sweep of coastline between Little River and Fort Bragg, but you can veer inland for different views. Interior Mendocino is dotted with redwood groves, wineries, off-the-beaten-path parks and small towns that extend a warm welcome to travelers with pets. Take Highway 101 north from Cloverdale to reach Ukiah, Willits and Leggett, where you'll find the winding Eel River and an irresistibly kitschy roadside attraction: the <u>Chandelier Drive-Thru Tree Park. Don't get skunked by the Skunk Train

For more than 130 years, this <u>No. 1 vintage excursion train</u> in California (it started out as a logging train carrying cargo and workers) has traveled through Northern California redwood forests. These days, there are two departure points — Fort Bragg, on the Mendocino Coast, and Willits, inland off Hwy. 101. The original name was the California Western Railroad, and has been known as the <u>"Skunk Train"</u> since 1925. <u>Read more...</u>


Become a water dog in Mendo County


